In the classroom

In Stage 3 maths we have been looking at some year 7 maths Naplan questions and discovering some gaps in our mathematical knowledge. We've been converting 24 hour time to am/pm, learning definitions for 'polygon', 'horizontal', 'vertical', 'perpendicular' and 'parallel'. We've also been learning how to find the area of a triangle (half the base times the height). In our mentals books we've been practising converting the mass of objects from mL to L and lengths from cm to m and m to km. Lots of fun. We love our maths groups! In reading groups in the Diamonds room we are focussing on our comprehension skills. We look at what the character's intentions are and how they are feeling. We also look at interesting words that we haven't heard of before. Our latest one is 'vexed'. While reading Margaret Wild books we've been discovering some fantastic verbs like; tore, yanking, shoving, toppling, tumbling, tossing, catapulted, hurtled, plunged and somersaulted. These interesting words can be used in our writing. We've also been looking closely at how Margaret Wild uses things like personification and similes to make her stories 'come alive'.

What is happening in the Opals room!

Every week in Literacy we watch BTN (Behind the News) and discuss news issues for the week. We then go on the BTN website and complete the quiz. We have also been practising spelling words, ready to compete in our school spelling bee. We have entered the Premier Spelling Bee (this was done late so we haven't had much time with everything going on) and the Stage 2 and 3 students have been working on learning and practising the words. We will have our school spelling bee on Friday, with our two finalists for both stages going on to compete in September in Ballina. Stage 2 have been working on Patterns and Algebra for the past two weeks in Maths. We have looked at inverse operations with

additions and subtraction and 'magic numbers' in triangles. We recognised that addition and subtraction are like 'opposites', for example 3+2=5 so 5-2=3. We also found out what commutative property means. This is when numbers can just swap places and we still get the same answer, like 4 + 6=10 and 6+4 =10.

Diamonds

This term in Literacy we are continuing our group work on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, rotating around work stations covering spelling, grammar, reading, comprehension, handwriting and writing. At the moment we are focussing on persuasive text in preparation for our public speaking competition. The children are typing their ideas directly onto computers. This has been an exciting time, watching the children (particularly the Kindy) learn how to use the mouse, log-on procedures, finding the desired keys and how to save their work.

In Numeracy we have been doing lots of counting and shape patterns, flipping, sliding and rotating and finding missing parts.

Science – The Diamonds are looking at 'Meeting Needs' – of plants and animals (including humans).

The Opals will be exploring 'Heat', its sources and uses.
